ALL ROADS LED TO SOWETO, A SYMBOLIC CHOICE OF VENUE FOR THE FUTURE CHAMPIONS 2011 TOURNAMENT.

Gauteng is South Africa's smallest province in terms of size but the most powerful economically and has a rich sporting and political history. This makes it the perfect location to show how football can help unite the world and inspire young people to nurture ambition and achieve their personal goals.

Talented young footballers from across the globe converged on the Nike Football Training Centre in Soweto, the former township famed for its struggle against apartheid. The neighbourhood of Nelson Mandela, the country's first post-apartheid President, is now a sprawling melting pot of cultures and a popular tourist destination.

The Gauteng province is South Africa's 'gateway' with a dynamic multicultural hub and an outstanding sporting pedigree... truly the 'Home of Champions'.

The Final of the 2010 FIFA World Cup™ was held at Soccer City in Johannesburg and its club teams form the backbone of the national professional football league, the Premier Soccer League.

Such an impressive record for delivering top class sport was enhanced with the Future Champions Gauteng, an under 17s tournament which allowed future generations to enjoy the beautiful game and possibly discover the stars of tomorrow.

How appropriate then that Gauteng, a region once noted for its gold mines, should lead the search for more nuggets, this time on the football field







THE TOURNAMENT

THE TEAMS

A dozen sides competed in this year's event with four South African teams in the form of Orlando Pirates, Jomo Cosmos, Mamelodi Sundowns and BidVest Wits, taking on eight international entrants.

The invited international sides were PSV Eindhoven (Netherlands), CF Pachuca (Mexico), CD Universidad Catolica (Chile), Clube Atletico Mineiro (Brazil), FC Rubin Kazan (Russia), K-Stars (Zambia), Apapa Golden Stars (Nigeria) and Young Zebras FC (Botswana).

GAUTENG CUP

The Gauteng PSL teams qualified for the International Tournament via the Gauteng Cup. This weekend event was staged at Marks Park, Emmarentia, with the assistance of the Premier Soccer League and featured Orlando Pirates, Mamelodi Sundowns, Bidvest Wits, Jomo Cosmos, Kaizer Chiefs, SuperSport United, Moroka Swallows, SAFA School of Excellence, Tuks and FC AK. The top four teams earned the honour to represent Gauteng against the visiting teams from all over the world.

THE DRAW

The all-important draw was carried out at the Nike Football Training Centre in Soweto five days before the event began. It was conducted by Tournament Director Ray Whelan, from organisers Global Sports International, and Lebogang Maile, MEC for the Gauteng Department of Sport, Arts, Culture and Recreation.

THE FORMAT

The twelve teams were split into four groups of three teams with one of the South African sides in each pool. The teams played each other in a round-robin format with one further match against a team from another group. The top sides in each pool advanced to the semi finals with the remaining eight sides involved in a play-off to determine positions five to twelve. All matches were sixty minutes in duration.

ELIGIBILITY

The tournament was open to players from each club team born on or after January 1, 1994. All players were required to present their passports or ID issued by their Government to prove eligibility.

THE STADIA

The main venue was the Nike Football Training Centre, a highly acclaimed modern facility in Soweto. Each club also played one match at the Moruleng Stadium, near Rustenburg in North West Province, giving the players an opportunity to experience a completely different environment and broaden their experience of South Africa through the 'gateway' of Gauteng.

THE FACILITIES

Gauteng provided first class facilities to ensure that every single player and official went home from the Future Champions Tournament with a memory of a trip that would last a lifetime. Thanks to their generous hosts, they stayed in the region's top accommodation and received an outstanding culinary service. The football facilities were among the most to date in the world, ensuring that players were able to perform to the peak of their ability.

VIP TRAVEL

The next generation of footballers need to be well looked after so it was only right that they were given the star treatment throughout their stay in South Africa. Everything was laid on to guarantee their comfort and convenience, including police escorts between locations to give that VIP touch. After all, our guests are Very Important People and such attention to detail matters greatly when hosting such a prestigious event.

LIVE COVERAGE

The Future Champions Gauteng attracted wide media coverage, receiving exposure from both broadcasters and the written press.

South Africatelevision broadcaster SuperSport screened two matches live on each day of the tournament to underline their commitment to giving youth football a high profile.

THE TOURNAMENT KICKS OFF!

FC Rubin Kazan from Russia launched proceedings on day one in a contest between past and future FIFA World Cup™ hosts.

They made their tournament debut against BidVest Wits, one of four clubs from South Africa where memories of staging the FIFA World Cup™ in 2010 are still fresh.

Russia's turn will come in 2018 and it was a low key start by their representatives as they suffered a 1-0 defeat, though it was to prove their only loss as they eventually progressed to the Final.

The close nature of the competition was illustrated by the fact that four of the six matches on the opening day ended in draws with Mamelodi Sundowns the only other winners, a 4-1 triumph over CD Universidad Catolica underlining their early intentions to show the best of Gauteng football.

It was clear from the outset that the well equipped Nike Football Training Centre was going to prove a marvellous set-up for all the matches.

Once all the organisation and planning was over, the stage would be left to the youths to produce their dazzling skills amid a carnival atmosphere.

In truth, such an intriguing clash of styles and cultures from across the globe was bound to guarantee that football was the real winner ultimately!

THE OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony was held on Matchday 1. Programme Director Ray Whelan convened on the field along with key delegates from Gauteng Department of Sport, Arts, Culture and Recreation. Traditional Zulu and gumboot dancing kicked off the programme, engaging the crowd with some entertaining moves. Director of Sport, Ivor Hoff, opened the formal proceedings with a Welcome Address, followed by MEC Maile leading the Official Opening of the 2011 Tournament. HOD Mhaga gave a brief note of thanks and the MEC thereafter kicked off the ceremonial first ball.

MORE ACTION FROM SOWETO

More high tempo effort in Soweto, especially from the Nigerian players of Apapa Golden Stars who ran out 5-1 winners over Young Zebras FC.

Nigeria has led the way in the emergence of the African football nations, having qualified for the FIFA World Cup^{TM} on four occasions in the modern era.

CF Pachuca from Mexico registered their first win, beating Zambia's K-Stars 2-1 while there were eye-catching displays from Brazilian representatives Clube Atletico Mineiro, 3-1 winners against BidVest Wits, and Mamelodi Sundowns who pipped PSV Eindhoven 1-0.

Predicting an eventual winner was proving tough for the crowds who were being entertained by the high standard of skill on display.

The only certainty was that a new name would be inscribed on the Future Champions Gauteng Trophy to succeed winners from Argentina (Boca Juniors) in 2009 and China (Shandong Luneng) in 2010.

A VISIT TO SOCCER CITY









Originally opened in 1989, Soccer City received a major upgrade to become the flagship venue for the 2010 World CupTM - the first World Cup to be held on African soil.

Shaped like a bowl the stadium design was integrated from a traditional African pot known as a Calabash and the lights beneath the structure symbolise the burning of the pot, creating a spectacular image at night. With a capacity of 94,000, it is the largest football stadium in Africa and staged eight matches during the FIFA 2010 World CupTM.

The climax of the day was the semi finals in which Clube Atletico Mineiro edged out CF Pachuca 1-0 and FC Rubin Kazan beat K-Stars 4-1 on penalties after the teams had finished 1-1 after regulation time

And so the large party – each club was allowed a squad of up to 18 players and four officials - made their way back to Gauteng to prepare for their final matches.




