



The Rainbow Nation is now one of the world's favourite destinations enjoyed by millions of visitors each year.

Its most colourful province is Gauteng which boasts the country's largest city and business hub Johannesburg, the political capital Tshwane and much more besides. Gauteng offers a truly authentic flavour of a wonderful country with a fascinating heritage and a dynamic future.

It provided the perfect backdrop for the ninth edition of the Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament, now recognised as one of the top U17 competitions on the global football calendar.

This weeklong festival of football is a chance to showcase emerging talent from across four continents - Africa, the Americas, Asia and Europe.



The 2017 action was held at the Nike Football Centre in Soweto, a symbolic venue in the township famed for its struggle against apartheid.

The Future Champions Gauteng is organised by Global Sports International in conjunction with the Gauteng Provincial Government.

Future Champions is a project of inspiration and a stimulus for development, using the power and popularity of football as an impetus for growth. It has reached tens of thousands of youngsters since its inception in 2009, running transformative programmes that encourage social and educational cohesion.

Future Champions empowers coaches from around the Province, providing an opportunity for new talents to emerge. For host cities and countries, it showcases Gauteng's rich cultural heritage, world-class infrastructure and diversity.



GAUTENG SCHOOLS CUP

The Schools Cup reaches out into the communities of Gauteng Province, offering talented youngsters from 16 schools the opportunity to shine on a bigger stage.

Esokwazi Secondary School, from the Sebokeng township in southern Gauteng, seized their chance impressively by becoming the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng Schools Cup winners.

It was a near flawless display from Esokwazi as they conceded just one goal in five matches during an exciting day's action at the George Thabe Stadium in Sharpeville.

The group stages started promisingly, registering convincing wins over Pholosho Secondary (5-0) and Chipa-Tabane Secondary (4-0) before a 1-1 draw with New Model Private College.

Esokwazi saw off Kwadukathole Comprehensive 2-0 in the semi-finals, saving the best till last with a 4-0 triumph over Bophelo Impilo Community in the final.

Bophelo Impilo Community drew a blank after scoring 24 goals in just four matches, including a 12-0 group win over M.H. Baloyi Secondary, and a 7-0 success against Magaliesburg Secondary.

Unsurprisingly, Bophelo Impilo Community were the biggest contributors to the 102-goal tally in 27 tournament matches.

The four semi-finalists, including Kingsway High School, qualified for the Future Champions Gauteng Cup, just one step away from the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament.

The tournament was organised by Global Sports International in conjunction with Gauteng's Department of Sport, Arts, Culture and Recreation and Department of Education.

Gauteng MEC for Sport, Arts, Culture and Recreation Ms Faith Mazibuko praised the growth of this important youth tournament: "The Future Champions Gauteng Schools Cup is the beginning of a wonderful journey for these youngsters and we're excited by the fresh talent that emerged this year. Sports is such a crucial component in the development of youngsters, from the perspective of both body and mind, and so schools sport, in particular, is very important to us."

Gauteng MEC for Education, Mr Panyaza Lesufi, echoed these sentiments: "The tournament is a highlight on our schools sports programme and we're delighted to be partnering with Future Champions again in 2017. The Gauteng Department of Education believes that fit bodies make for healthy minds and so we encourage all our learners to partake in sports to boost their academic potential."

Players in the Schools Cup also took part in a life skills course conducted by Love Life focusing on HIV/ Aids awareness. Other tournament sponsors included Sedgars Sport, Clinix Health Group as well as Gauteng Coaches who provided transport for learners and players from surrounding areas to attend the action-packed day in Sharpeville and take part in the Future Players Talent Search.



GAUTENG CUP

The world famous Orlando Pirates added another trophy to their cabinet by claiming the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng Cup.

The Young Buccaneers, steeped in tradition as one of the oldest football clubs in South Africa, held their nerve to defeat Mamelodi Sundowns 5-4 on penalties in the Final after a 1-1 draw in normal time. Their third success equalled the record of SuperSport United as academy teams continued their domination of the competition.

Energy was not a problem for the Pirates with a 2-1 semi-final win over Bidvest Wits, while defending champions Sundowns waited patiently for the winners after overcoming SAFA Tshwane 3-0 in the last four.

The semi-finalists all booked their place in the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament as group winners, along with University of Pretoria who claimed the fifth spot as the best-placed runner-up.

The goals flowed freely in the group phase, with an average of 4.63 goals a game and eight hat tricks.

The prolific Nelson Mosupoe scored all seven goals for SAFA Tshwane in their 7-1 triumph over Esokwazi High School, while Pirates striker Lyle Foster plundered six goals in an 8-1 win over Kingsway High School giving him 10 goals overall in the pool stages alone.

The prestigious U17 tournament consisted of 16 of the best academy and schools teams from across the province, tacking the action to Reiger Park as they competed for the coveted prize at WJ Clements Stadium.

Supported by the City of Ekurhuleni, the community came out for a fun-filled day of thrills and nail-biting competition. Local youth teams and players took part in the Future Players Talent Search while Love Life were again on hand with their ground-breakers for interactive sessions on healthy lifestyles.



INTERNATIONAL TOURNAMENT

THE TEAMS

The inclusion of a team from India in the Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament was a welcome sign of the rapid development of Asian football.

The Football School of India, based in Mumbai, made their debut in the 12-strong field in 2017, a year in which India hosts the FIFA Under 17 World Cup.

Going to Gauteng gave them a glimpse of what to expect from hosting an international tournament and how the power of sport can bring countries and cultures together on the same field of play.

As 2016 Champions, Atletico Madrid from Spain were favourites with Russian giants Spartak Moscow also providing a formidable threat on their debut.

A strong European challenge was expected to come from top Belgian outfit Club Brugge and Serie A side Torino FC.

Club Tijuana, from Mexico, made their fifth appearance in a tournament they previously won back in 2013, while a Nigerian Professional Football League (NPFL) U17 All Stars side would bring another dimension to the African challenge.

The five South African sides completing the line-up were Orlando Pirates, Bidvest Wits, University of Pretoria, Mamelodi Sundowns and SAFA Tshwane, all of whom qualified from the Gauteng Cup.

THE DRAW AND MEDIA LAUNCH

All eyes were on SAFA House when the Draw and Media Launch took place for the Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament just a few days before the action began.

The excitement was captured during a broadcast on SuperSport screened across the continent. Social media was buzzing with anticipation as the teams discovered their opponents while print, radio and other media outlets also announced the all-important line-up.

Dignitaries present included representatives from Gauteng Provincial Government and co-organisers Global Sports International, SAFA and the Soweto Football Association.

The 2017 tournament was also supported by the Premier Soccer League, Love Life, Clinix Health, La Liga, Sedgars, Debonairs Pizza, Levati, MotorDeal, Gauteng Coaches, HIP, Häagen-Dazs and SCORE Energy drinks.

A special draw was held involving school representatives from Soweto as part of the popular 'Adopt a Team' programme. Chosen schools drew the name of the team they would support throughout the tournament.





THE VENUE

South Africa was the winner when the futuristic Nike Football Training Centre was built in the heart of Soweto. This impressive venue was the first of its kind in Africa and since opening in 2010, many thousands of footballers have taken advantage of its world-class facilities. Its unique design has players and coaches at the heart of everything, providing an excellent safe and secure community facility. The complex has two full-sized artificial pitches, two junior turf pitches, dressing rooms, gym, medical rooms, media centre, VIP roof areas, warm-up area and a coaching arena.

THE FORMAT

The 12 teams were split into four groups of three teams with one South African side in each pool, apart from Group D which had two SA representatives. Teams played each other in a round-robin format with one further crossover match against a team from another group. The top sides in each pool advanced to the semi-finals with the remaining eight teams involved in classification games to determine positions five to 12. All matches were two halves of 30 minutes.



VIP TREATMENT

Guests enjoyed VIP treatment throughout their stay in South Africa as at every Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament. Players, coaches and officials were looked after in style by the hosts and organisers as befits a top class tournament. Security escorts made each journey between locations as easy and efficient as possible. The comfort and convenience of the travelling parties was a priority, enabling them to fully focus on the football and enjoy their visit and the overall South African experience.

LIVE COVERAGE

Media from the seven countries with clubs competing in the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament provided extensive coverage of the event. Social media, written and broadcast press followed the teams' progress, reflecting the tournament's ever increasing global profile. Official club websites provided regular updates on the action, while the tournament's official Twitter account @FutureChampsU17 and Facebook page gave instant news of goals as the drama unfolded.

In the host country, South Africa, there was also widespread interest with viewers of the South African television broadcaster SuperSport watching live games each day from the venue. This was also streamed live on the official website www.future-champions.net. Highlights were shown online and as part of the extensive television coverage.

NETWORKING LUNCHESES

Lunches throughout the week were hosted by various Future Champions partners, treating guests to classic South African fare and tastes from around the globe. Gauteng Coaches sponsored a VIP lunch on the 21st and Clinix Health Group hosted one on the 22nd for all guests and media, bringing businesses, personalities and organisations together in the heart of Soweto.

A Spanish themed luncheon was served on the Semi-Finals day courtesy of La Liga and the Spanish Chamber of Commerce featuring specialty dishes such as paella. The Finals day featured Italian delicacies courtesy of the HIP Alliance.

A daily happy hour took place each afternoon of the event, with treats from Haagen-Dazs, Krispy Kreme and Debonairs on offer to guests.

DAY ONE

THE TOURNAMENT BEGINS

Spartak Moscow announced their arrival at the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament in style.

The side from the Russian capital – venue for the FIFA World Cup™ Final in 2018 – enjoyed a resounding victory over the Football School of India on the opening day.

Danila Proshliakov scored six goals in an outstanding individual display, while there were also two goals each for Dmitry Markitesov and Mikhail Ignitov. Spartak follow in the footsteps of Rubin Kazan, the first Russian side to compete at the tournament in 2011.

This was a steep learning curve for the Indian side, underlining the strength of U17 football globally.

Atletico Madrid made an encouraging start with a 4-0 success over University of Pretoria, while former winners Torino and Club Tijuana both suffered defeats by South African sides.

A goal from Likhanyile Ndlendle earned Mamelodi Sundowns a 1-0 win over Tijuana and Bidvest Wits beat the Italians 2-1.

Club Brugge defeated Orlando Pirates by the same scoreline. In the opening match of the day, SAFA Tshwane drew 1-1 with an NFPL All Stars team from Nigeria.

The Johannesburg club defeated the Football School of India in a thrilling display of attacking football. Malik Mashinini scored six of the goals himself, while there were also hat-tricks for Ethan Andrews and Leo Mert.

Another ace marksman on Day Two was Danila Proshliakov, from Spartak Moscow, who scored a hat-trick in a 3-0 win over SAFA Tshwane to take his tally for the tournament to nine goals in two games.

That set up an intriguing showdown for top spot in Group B between Wits and Spartak, with the South African side leading on goal difference after two wins each.

NPFL All Stars took charge of their group following a 3-0 win over Torino, while Atletico Madrid drew 0-0 with Mamelodi Sundowns. Pirates beat University of Pretoria 4-0 thanks to two goals from exciting prospect Lyle Foster and Club Tijuana overcame Club Brugge 2-1.

DAY THREE

THE FINAL GROUP GAMES

Respected European sides Torino and Club Brugge both have great faith in South Africa's ability to further aid the development of youth football globally.

Torino were one of the first teams in Italy to adopt a youth policy, as early as the 1930s, and have won a record nine domestic youth league titles.

Their head of youth Massimo Bava said: "To return to Johannesburg is always exciting for all of us. We're proud to participate in the 2017 edition of the tournament."

Likewise, Club Brugge - winners of 14 Belgian league titles - view the Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament as an important fixture in their calendar. They have a long history of developing African talent.

Pascal De Maesschalck, head of the club's academy, said: "Evolution in football is more and more thinking and acting globally. This tournament allows us to compete with different teams from around the world and learn more about the way football is played in Africa."

Alas, Torino, winners in 2015, ended this group campaign without a victory after a 1-1 draw with SAFA Tshwane. Club Brugge also missed out on a place in the semi-finals, losing 1-0 to Mamelodi Sundowns whose victory took them through.

Bidvest Wits clinched a 3-2 win over Spartak Moscow in the deciding match in Group B despite two goals from Dmitry Markitesov for the Russians. Malik Mashinini, with his seventh goal of the tournament, settled the match for 'The Clever Boys'.

NPFL All Stars booked a semi-final place with a win over the Football School of India, with Toluwalase Arokodare grabbing four goals.

Atletico Madrid went through after edging out Orlando Pirates 2-1 in a Group D decider, while Club Tijuana ended the group phase with a 3-0 victory over University of Pretoria.

CULTURAL VISITS



Gauteng has got it all and guests attending the Future Champions Gauteng 2017 International Tournament saw for themselves the scale of what the Province has to offer.

Gauteng Tourism Authority took teams and media on a tour of Gauteng's most spectacular and historic sites, providing insight into just some of the Province's many attractions.

Multilingual tour guides were provided as players and coaches had the unique opportunity of experiencing South Africa's fractured past and its project of renewal. It undoubtedly served as a day they will treasure for many years to come, giving them a taste of the beauty and buzz of Gauteng.

LESEDI CULTURAL VILLAGE ►

Experience the colourful sights and sounds of authentic African villages, learning about the cultures of the Zulu, Xhosa, Pedi, Basotho, Nguni and Ndebele people. Traditional song and dance is part of the entertainment for visitors to this popular tourist destination.

Teams were treated to a special buffet lunch and a spirited performance of indigenous dancing during their visit to the cultural village, along with a stop at the craft market for artisan gifts and handmade treasures.





◀ LION PARK

Take a walk on the wild side at Lion Park to see Africa's animal kingdom. Lion Park is neither a game reserve nor a zoo and is divided into two sections - one for herbivores such as zebras, giraffes and antelopes and the other for predators such as lions, hyenas and cheetahs. A fascinating day out on safari in this Gauteng wonderland.





APARTHEID MUSEUM ▶

The Apartheid Museum illustrates the rise and fall of apartheid. Exhibits assembled by curators, filmmakers, historians and designers include provocative film footage, photographs, text panels and artefacts illustrating the events and human stories that are part of the epic saga, known as apartheid. For anyone wanting to understand the devastating reality of apartheid in South Africa, a visit to the this Museum is essential.





◀ VILAKAZI STREET

Two famous residents of Vilakazi Street turned this Soweto landmark into one of the most symbolic places in political history. Its main attraction is No 8115, known as Mandela House, where former South African President Nelson Mandela lived and is now restored to what it resembled when he first moved in. Human rights activist Archbishop Desmond Tutu lived in the same road, making it the only street in the world to have been home to two former Nobel Peace Prize winners. The guided tour also included a visit to the Hector Pieterse Monument built in remembrance of the first victim of the 1976 student uprising.



▲ SOCCER CITY STADIUM

For sports fans catching a glimpse of a famous soccer stadium is always magical. Soccer City was the venue for the first FIFA World Cup™ Final on African soil in 2010 when Spain defeated the Netherlands 1-0.





DAY FIVE

THE PLAY-OFF MATCHES

An All Stars team from the Nigerian Professional Football League (NPFL) were aiming to become the first side from the African continent to win the prestigious Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament.

Typical West African flair saw them knock out Mamelodi Sundowns 3-0 in the semi-final, thanks to two goals from Nazi Yahaya and a strike by Sadig Abdullahi.

Nigerian football has long been at the forefront of football on the continent, producing the likes of players such as Jay-Jay Okocha, Finidi George, Joseph Yobo, Nwankwo Kanu, Vincent Enyeama and the late Stephen Keshi.

Nigeria has already been represented by Apapa Golden Stars, Bridge FC and Saki West at the tournament.

Their final opponents were Atletico Madrid who defeated Bidvest Wits 5-2, having led 4-0 at the interval. Spartak Moscow missed two spot kicks in a 4-2 penalty shootout loss to Orlando Pirates after an entertaining goalless draw.

SAFA Tshwane were well beaten 3-0 by Club Tijuana and University of Pretoria defeated the Football School of India with Valli Baloyi grabbing five goals and Sibusiso Nkosi four, to earn a tie with Torino who pipped Club Brugge 2-1.

THE FINAL DAY

Atletico Madrid are the kings of Gauteng again!

The Spanish outfit retained the Future Champions Gauteng International Tournament to show the club's future is in safe hands.

A unique bond was forged after Spain won their first FIFA World Cup in South Africa in 2010 and strengthened here when Atletico defeated Nigerian side NPFL All Stars 2-1 in the Final at the Football Training Centre.

Alberto Salido was the hero, scoring the winning goal after a penalty from Nazi Yahaya, his seventh goal of the tournament, had cancelled out Adrian Luque's opener.

Mamelodi Sundowns won the battle of the South African sides, overcoming Bidvest Wits 2-0 to claim the bronze medal for their best finish to the tournament.

Club Tijuana took fifth place after a 3-0 success over Orlando Pirates. Spartak Moscow defeated SAFA Tshwane 5-1 as Danila Proshliakov, the competition's top scorer, took his tournament tally to a remarkable 11 goals.

Torino claimed ninth position after a 5-0 win over University of Pretoria while the Football School of India and Club Brugge swapped players in a cultural bonding exercise to give them experience of teaming up with players from different continents and backgrounds. The game ended 5-5.









CLOSING CEREMONY

Broadcast live on SuperSport across the continent, the glittering Closing Ceremony and Trophy Celebrations included representatives and dignitaries from Gauteng Provincial Government, Gauteng Tourism Authority, the Soweto Football Association and Global Sports International. Soweto school choirs once again led the crowd in a rousing rendition of the national anthem, followed by a meet-and-greet on the pitch with Future Champions finalists Atletico Madrid and the NFPL All-Stars.

Winners of the Future Players and Future Coaches programmes were announced during the proceedings, receiving national and international press exposure for their achievements.

Embassy officials and Future Champions Gauteng Ambassador Refiloe Jane joined in the Trophy Celebrations, congratulating Atletico Madrid on their well-deserved victory as 2017 Champions. Silver and bronze medals were provided to NFPL All-Stars and Mamelodi Sundowns respectively, in recognition of their outstanding performances during the week.

FUTURE COACHES



The 2017 Future Coaches Gauteng comprised a clinic and SAFA D Licence Course for over a hundred participants. The International Coaching Clinic exposed Gauteng coaches to some of the latest developments in youth training, techniques and tactics in developing well-rounded players and leadership in football. Coaches from across Gauteng were invited to participate in the 2017 programme, which included the opportunity of running skills tests for the Future Players programme.

Future Coaches Gauteng fosters a unique and powerful programme of education and training, motivating and inspiring future leaders in sport. The alliance with SAFA additionally provides aspiring coaches with professional coaching qualifications as they embark upon their careers.

Dedicated coach Sakhile Nkomo from Orlando East in Johannesburg scooped the Future Coach prize after taking part in the weeklong Coaching Clinic. Nkomo coaches Phalamorodu FC in the SAB League of his community as well as having his own team of juniors, Orlando Real Sweepers FC. He will be joining the Future Players Gauteng 2017 winners on their Spanish adventure later in the year as a mentor and coach for the trio.



"Since I was named the Future Coaches winner for 2017, I have worked harder to better myself as a coach so that I can also help others to get better. I have gained hope that even young coaches from disadvantaged areas can make it in the world of soccer. I am going to use

Future Players Gauteng aims to be the benchmark in talent identification and mass participation life skills development. The aspirational and motivational programme keeps thousands of teenagers across the Province engaged in healthy activities, often held in communities facing poverty, crime and substance abuse. It empowers and nurtures youth participating in the programme, broadening their horizons in the quest to source the most promising and talented young players.





FROM GAUTENG TO SPAIN



In partnership with Gauteng Provincial Government and Global Sports International, La Liga are making dreams come true for up and coming football talent by organising an annual trip to the footballing hotbed of Spain as part of their on-going support for South African football.

2016 Future Players Gauteng winners Philane Kunene, Prince Moeketsi and Charlton Jade qualified from 100 finalists after showcasing their skills across the Province. They were accompanied by Future Coach winner Christa Flora Kgampe on an eight-day trip, which began in the Spanish capital.

A high-speed train took them to Valencia to watch the Valencia-Atletico Madrid match in La Liga and attend beach soccer training, one of football's fastest growing disciplines.

The guests then watched La Liga side Villarreal put through their paces in a training session before returning to Madrid for a tour of the fabled Bernabeu Stadium, home of Real Madrid.

To crown their visit, they saw the likes of world stars Fernando Torres and Antoine Griezmann during a training session led by coach Diego Simeone. The youngsters also trained with the under17 sides of Atletico, Valencia and Villarreal, giving them a rare opportunity to compare skills, while coach Kgampe took a training session in Villarreal.

Several sightseeing tours and a visit to the South African embassy completed a memorable trip and made them determined to make the most of their future.

It was the trip of a lifetime for the lucky quartet, taking them one step closer to achieving their dreams:

"We trained with Villarreal, met players like Torres, Puyo and Xavi, saw some amazing matches and learned so much," said Charlton Jade. "From playing foot volley on the beach to visiting the Royal Palace and seeing a flamenco show, every day was unforgettable."

Prince Moeketsi was equally enthusiastic about their life-changing adventure: "We saw so many things - met Fernando Torres twice in a week, visited the stadiums of Atletico de Madrid, FC Valencia and Real Madrid. It was really inspiring; I never imagined that one day I would see these things! It motivated me to work hard and believe in myself, so that one day I can return as a professional."

"It was out of this world," said Christa Kgamphe, Future Coach winner and 2016 Ambassador. "We trained with the best and saw some spectacular sites. We met so many famous people and legends of football. Thanks to Future Champions, La Liga and Gauteng Provincial Government for giving us this trip of a lifetime. We will cherish it forever."

La Liga Africa Director Antonio Barradas said: "For La Liga it's essential to commit to projects like Future Champions since grass roots football and the search for young talented players are part of La Liga's resolution to give back to the African continent.

"Every day we work on different projects with the aim of conveying the positive values that football embodies. The kids who had the opportunity to go to Spain declared it was a very exciting and rewarding experience, and thanks to La Liga, they could get a bit closer to Spanish football. This is very important to us."

ADOPT A TEAM CAMPAIGN

Coordinated in partnership with Gauteng Department of Education, the Future Champions Adopt-a-Team Campaign has become a highlight of the Gauteng International Tournament, with the inclusion of Soweto primary schools. The twelve selected schools have developed on-going legacy partnerships with Future Champions Gauteng; teachers and heads of schools established close ties to those involved with the project along with many of the participating international teams.

Each school learned of their team and country to support at the Media Launch in front of gathered press and dignitaries. Hundreds of schoolchildren involved in the campaign attended matches and took part in official proceedings, whilst meeting some of the world's top U17 players. They displayed flags of their adopted countries and went to great lengths in showing their support, arriving at the stadium with faces painted and songs prepared.

Selected students had the prestigious opportunity of being team mascots for live televised matches, accompanying players onto the pitch. Provided with Future Champions merchandise as well as sponsored merchandise from supporting partners such as La Liga and their adopted clubs, the schools were treated as VIPs throughout the week.

Dozens of children from special needs schools around Gauteng were included in the campaign, treated to Debonairs pizzas and other goodies. They participated as team mascots and played a key role in the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, making for a highly memorable experience.






WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

The inclusion of girls and women in Future Champions Gauteng activities and events has expanded each year of the project, with the Future Players and Future Coaches programmes empowering and training thousands of girls and women as players, coaches and leaders in their communities.

The 2017 Future Champions Gauteng tournaments included girls and women's teams in exhibition and curtain-raiser matches. Tshwane University of Technology FC and JW FC were invited to compete in the women's football component of the International Tournament, playing their match on the Finals day to a packed stadium. JW FC was crowned as the women's champion of the 2017 Future Champions Gauteng International, receiving special acknowledgement in the Trophy Celebrations.

As the official Future Champions Gauteng Ambassador and first Future Players winner, Refiloe Jane has a long-term partnership with the project. Refiloe was discovered through the Future Players initiative in 2009 at the age of 15 and has gone on to represent South Africa at the 2012 Olympics in London and the 2016 Olympics in Rio as a vice-captain of Banyana Banyana as well as a former captain of Mamelodi Sundowns women's team.

Future Champions Gauteng has invested in her career as a footballer and leader, with Refiloe having completed her degree in sports science management at the Vaal University of Technology whilst captaining their women's team. Refiloe Jane was involved in all activities of the 2017 International Tournament and serves as a mentor to the Future Players winners, along with spearheading the inclusion of women's teams in the competition.



FOOTBALL CLINICS

Teams participating in the International Tournament took part in special outreach football clinics organised by the Gauteng Department of Education. The Football School of India, Club Tijuana and FC Brugge ran clinics with school teams in Lenasia, Eldorado Park and Soweto, imparting their skills, knowledge and experience to local players whilst fostering an exchange with coaching staff of the participating teams.



GREENING INITIATIVES

Recycling initiatives were prominent at this year's event. A Future Champions Gauteng 'Green Team' was established, comprising volunteers from Soweto. All plastic bottles and other trash was collected and recycled throughout the week. Environmental awareness was promoted through their activities, including a focus on reducing water wastage.



CULTIVATING A CULTURE OF VOLUNTEERISM

A total of 240 volunteers provided assistance in various areas of the International Tournament and Coaching Clinic, deployed in a variety of tasks from logistical duties to media and hospitality. They were remunerated and also provided with Future Champions merchandise besides having the opportunity of working on this prestigious event.

In 2016, Future Champions Gauteng spearheaded on-going student partnerships with Vaal University of Technology and the University of Johannesburg

for the student volunteer programme. Students involved in the field of Sports Management were selected and trained to be part of the Future Champions team; they in turn were able to complete the necessary work experience for their programmes of study. The students gained invaluable experience during the planning and execution stages of the tournament, as it provided them with a unique opportunity to learn new skills in such a large-scale international event.

MOBILE HEALTH CLINIC

It provided an interactive space for youth to access information on sexual, emotional and physical health while being empowered by the LoveLife life-skills programme.

The programme encompasses a comprehensive life-skills curriculum that seeks to address and dismantle stigmas around HIV/Aids. Through their involvement with Future Champions Gauteng, LoveLife ground-breakers educate participants about the Sexually Transmitted Disease through the language of football. The curriculum inspires youth to lead healthier lifestyles and provides them with the tools to make more informed choices.
